About Lago Salvador...
The *Rio Negro* and the *Rio Solimoes* are the two largest waterways that form the Amazon River. Notice the quaint island right in the middle of the river's joining.

About Brazil...
Nowhere in South America is the catch phrase "land of contrasts" more appropriate than in Brazil. From one end to the other of this continent-size nation, you will go from tropical rain forest to urban jungle, from primitive native culture to modern high rises, from distressing poverty to embarrassing wealth. With the largest continuous coastline of any nation in the Americas (4,600 miles), Brazil differs itself from the rest of South America in that it is the only country to have been colonized by the Portuguese, therefore, the language spoken is Portuguese, not Spanish. To understand Brazil as a country, it is necessary to always keep in mind its awesome size. It ranks fifth worldwide: bigger than the continental United States, twice the size of India, and four times as large as Mexico but has only 176 million inhabitants.

About Manaus...
Over one million inhabitants reside in this capital of the State of "*Amazonas*". The discovery of the rubber plant (latex) lead the city to gain notoriety at the turn of the 20th century, leading the region to a great era of prosperity as the world's sole producer of rubber. Rubber plants were eventually smuggled out of the region to create today's competitive rubber market Today, *Manaus* is undergoing a successful attempt at revival.

About the Theater of Manaus. . .

The rubber boom ended abruptly in the 1920's with the emergence of a competitive Malaysian rubber market. The *Teatro Amazonas* was completed in 1896 to illustrate the opulence of the era, and still remains standing in the city of Manaus. The grandiose theater was restored to its former splendor through three major renovations, marking its culmination in 1990. Marble doorways from Italy, wrought-iron banisters from England, and French crystal chandeliers encapsulate the Italian Renaissance-style interior. Striking French tiles and Italian frescoes depict Amazon legends and provide a clear idea of the wealth and ostentation that marked the Amazon rubber boom. Caruso sang there, as did Carreras, Domingo and Pavarotti.

05:00/ 5:00am

When you wake up, the boat will be in a totally different area, much closer to the *Meeting of the waters*, where the Amazon River is born.

You will be awakened by a knock on your cabin door. Then you will hear, very loudly the voice of Luciano Pavoratti, belting out some of his loudest songs!!!!.

Board the canoe and embark on a special, very early morning sightseeing tour of a different kind. The guide will be a local who speaks fluent English. You will witness as the *selva amazonica* (Amazon Jungle), awakens before your very eyes.

Return to the boat.

Breakfast.

This morning you will be for the first time on the Solimoes River. You will notice that the color of the water no longer is black but very red (mud like). Remember, we still have not seen the Amazon River.

Luncheon on the boat (included in the tour price).

At this time you should have finally arrived at the *Encontro das aguas*, or the Meeting of the Waters, where the rivers Negro and Solimoes meet and "finally" form the Amazon River.

Begin your ride back to Manaus and then to the pier where you started the journey the day before.

About the Amazon. . .

For both outsiders and inhabitants of the Amazon, there is a mystical attraction to this legendary region and its two great constants, the river and the jungle. A flight over the jungle is an unforgettable experience; the jungle curves contours of the area's 1,000 rivers and is broken only occasionally by a clearing. From the sky, it is easy to believe that the Brazilian Amazon is the largest tropical rainforest in the world, larger than all of Western Europe and accounting for 60% of the nation's total territory. Despite its girth, the Amazon Region has only 16 million inhabitants, similar to the population of metropolitan New York. A trip on the Amazon River, especially between Belem and Manaus, is unmatched anywhere in the world. In some spots the Amazon is so wide that neither bank is visible, giving the impression of traversing an inland sea. At night, the only light that can be seen is that of the moon and stars, reinforcing the sense of being in one of the world's greatest wilderness areas.

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About Belo Horizonte. . .

Belo Horizonte is Brazil's third largest city with a population of 2.5 million. It is also the state capital of *Minas Gerais*, a state known for its conservative traditions as well as its gold, gemstones, and iron ore. In terms of family values and politics, the *Mineiros* are often considered the most conservative of all Brazilians. This modernized city lacks the historical value that nearby *Ouro Preto* offers, as it was founded in 1897, and is still considered to be a very young city. Ironically, the surrounding historical sites first entice the tourists' visit, but its examples of modern Brazilian architecture make Belo Horizonte's *Pampulha* neighborhood most unforgettable. One of the most famous modern structures is the Chapel of St. Francis, *Capela de São Francisco*, which was completed in 1943 by famed Brazilian architect Oscar Niemeyer, designer the country's capital *Brasilia*.

About Minas Gerais. . .

Brazil's mountainous central region is dominated by the state of *Minas Gerais*, which means "general mines" in Portuguese. The name refers to its great mineral wealth, typified by its once vast reserves of gold, diamond and semiprecious stones. Exploration of Minas Gerais began in the 17th century, when bands of adventurers from coastal areas came in search of Indian slaves and gold. The explorers found a black stone near the town of *Vila Rica* that was later verified to be pure gold (the black coloring was the result of iron oxide in the soil.) Vila Rica thus came to be called *Ouro Preto* (black gold), and the 18th century provoked a gold rush that for a time made Ouro Preto the *de facto* capital of the Portuguese colony. The legacy of this period is preserved in allegedly historical sites scattered throughout the mountains, commemorating Brazil's first gold rush with an abundance of Baroque churches and artwork.

About Ouro Preto. . .

Ouro Preto is the best known historical city in Brazil and is preserved as a national monument and World Heritage Site. The former gold rush capital is situated just south of *Belo Horizonte*, and its 3,200 ft elevation make Ouro Preto a city of narrow cobblestone alleys built on steep hills. The true treasures of the city, however, are its 13 colonial churches representing the supreme achievement of *Mineiro*–Baroque architecture.

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About the Vendors. . .
Each evening after 7:00 pm the vendors set up their booths on the *Avenida Atlântica*, directly in front of *Copacabana Beach*. They close at 1:00am. Some of the most beautiful crafts, clothes, paintings and sculptures imaginable can be purchased at extremely fair prices. Do not forget to bargain, the vendors expect it.

About the climate of Rio de Janeiro. . .
Rio de Janeiro is located on the Tropic of Capricorn, and its climate is just that: **tropical**. Summers are hot and humid with peak temperatures of 105°F/40 °C, and a daily average of 85° to 95°. In the winter, temperatures stay in the 70's, occasionally dipping into the 60's. The same pattern holds true for the entire Atlantic coastline, despite slightly higher temperatures in *Salvador*, located halfway between Rio and *Manaus*. There are 23 beaches in Rio proper, so, bring your bathing suit if you're not ready to buy a classic Brazilian string bikini or Speedo. Be forewarned, this it is culturally and socially acceptable norm, and even the portly people will wear them.

About Petropolis. . .
Just an hour drive outside *Rio de Janeiro* is the *Cidade Imperial*, renowned as the former summer residence of Emperor *Dom Pedro*. His son *Dom Pedro II* first developed and founded this city, previously known as *Corrego Secco*. The town was originally depicted as a small miserable village, but with the help of Julius Koler, the Emperor of Brazil, and 2700 German colonists, the city was finally established as a German colony in 1845. Its growth was slow, but the Emperor's choice to make it his summer residence also attracted many wealthy residents, and aided the railway opening in 1854, and the road opening in 1883. *Petropolis* has since become the summer residence of the Federal Government Diplomatic Corps of High Officials as this pleasant mountain resort offers cooler temperatures and less humidity than neighboring *Rio*, making it a popular weekend getaway for *Cariocas* (*Rio* natives). *Petropolis* was also the capital of the state of Rio de Janeiro from 1893 to 1903.

In the event proposed hotels and/or concert venues are not available, a suitable replacement will be offered.

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
